


Duties and Responsibilities of Audiologists

1. Perform audiological assessments such as screening to all the newborns (inborn, outborn and postnatal ward).
2. Perform diagnostic audiological tests where ever indicated to diagnose/confirm the hearing impairment.
3. Advice hearing aids where ever necessary and collaborates with ENT doctors for the prescribing hearing aids.
4. Counseling to the parents about the condition along with health care team.
5. Counsel the parents about the importance of auditory training and provide auditory training to the hearing impairment children.
6. Work as an interdisciplinary team member of the department of the neonatology and liaison with the other team member in formulating the comprehensive intervention programme in individualized early intervention programme in high risk clinic and also follow up clinic.
7. Periodic evaluation of the infants and toddlers with speech problems in the follow up clinic.
8. Maintaining the data of hearing impairment and interventions given.
9. Assist in the departmental activities assigned by the HOD.
10. Contributing to related research in the department.
11. Develop SOPs and dissemination of IEC material.
12. Ensure continuity of service through a good follow up.
13. Perform all the activities of speech language pathologist in his/her absence.
